Period of validity for certificates for construction products

Normally, certificates issued by notified bodies within the framework of the European Construction Products Directive (Directive 89/106/EEC - CPD) and the Construction Products Regulation (Regulation 305/2011/EU - CPR) have no expiry date.

This means that the certificate remains as long as the harmonized standard remains valid, unless the certificate is withdrawn by the issuing notified body. The market surveillance authorities of the European member states may ask the issuing notified body to confirm the validity of certificates issued by that body. For certificates issued by Dancert, the validity can be verified at www.dancert.com.

According to the CPR, article 66(2), certificates issued in accordance with the CPD, remains equally valid under the CPR.

IMPORTANT NOTICE:

According to CPR article 4(3), Member states shall presume the declaration of performance drawn up by the manufacturer to be accurate and reliable, unless they have objective indications to the contrary. Therefore, only the marked surveillance authorities are entitled to ask for a copy of the certificate referenced at the declaration of performance.

The building authorities of member states are not entitled to require manufacturers to submit certificate copies.

The certificate in question, 1073-CPD-803, is valid!
